

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE to a Successful Seller Drop off for Games and Puzzles

GAMES:



Sellers, when placing your games on the display tables, please place them upright on one side, with the title of the game facing up (see sample photo) Not only will it make it easy to see the title of the game, it will allow more games to be displayed in the space allotted for them, will keep the area neat, and attract more customers to see and purchase your items—a win-win for sellers and customers alike.



Be sure to tape up the edges of the game boxes, so no pieces will be lost.

Please note there is a special section at the end of the Games section for **card games**. Place those games upright on one side with the title facing upright in smaller boxes provided on the table to make them easier to display and see.



PUZZLES:

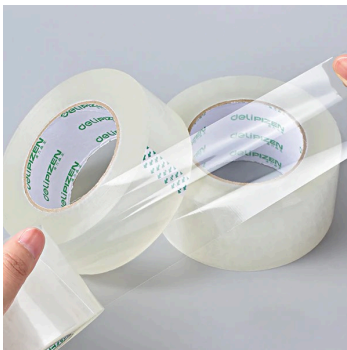
Sellers, when placing your puzzles to display, please place them in the appropriate category (Preschool puzzles, 100-500 pieces, 500-1000 pieces, and 1000+ pieces) with the box turned on edge, so the title of the puzzle can be seen (see sample photo). Placing them upright allows more puzzles to be placed on the tables, makes them easier for customers to see them and purchase them = more cash for your pocket!!



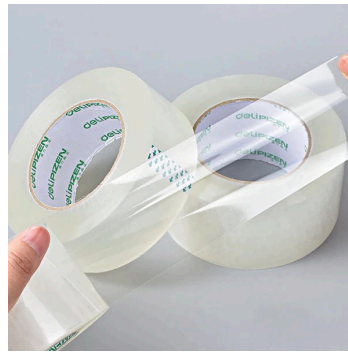
Uh oh.....

Be sure to tape up the puzzle boxes/containers, so no pieces will be lost.

Unfortunately, this puzzle was put out with no tape around the edges of the puzzle box, and its contents spilled over the table. Hard to sell a puzzle if all the pieces are not securely in its container.



If you have **flat preschool type puzzles**, be sure to secure the pieces by either wrapping the whole puzzle in plastic wrap & taping the 'package' securely or enclosing them in a ziplock bag and taping the bag shut. A great example is shown in these photographs.



Place the flat preschool type puzzles upright in a display box (provided on the display table).

The effect will be similar to file folders in a filing cabinet, so buyers can easily flip through them to easily see what is available.
